
prey of death; for He who willed the undoing of what had happened was God ...

Nowhere in Israel Have I Found as Much Faith

The Lord Jesus agreed to go to "the centurion's house to cure his servant, but he replied: I am not worthy to have you under my roof only say the word and my servant will be healed. In protesting his unworthiness the centurion showed himself worthy to have Christ enter not his house but his heart. Yet he could not have said this with such faith and humility unless he already bore within his heart the One he was too overawed to have within his house. In any case, there would have been no great happiness at the entry of the Lord Jesus within his walls if he were not present in his heart.

But what emboldened the centurion to act as he did? I am under authority myself, he said, and have soldiers under me; and I say to one man, Go, and he goes; to another, Come here, and he comes; to my servant, Do this, and he does it.

Now the man who said this was a Gentile as well as a centurion. He was a professional soldier and, as a centurion, acted according to his rank: subject to authority and exercise in authority, obeying as a subordinate and giving orders to those subordinate to him. As for the Lord, though living among the Jewish people, He was already beginning to make it known that His Church would extend throughout the whole world into which He was about to send His apostles. Although the Gentiles would not see him they would believe in him, whereas the Jewish leaders who saw him would put him to death.

In Times Of Impatience

Do not grow lazy, but imitate those who through faith and patience, are inheriting the promises Hebrews 6: 12.

But not only that – we even boast of our afflictions! We know that affliction makes for endurance, and endurance for tested virtue, and tested virtue for hope. And this hope will not leave us disappointed because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us Romans 5: 3-5.

Everything written before our time was written for our instruction, that we might derive hope from the lesson of patience and the words of encouragement in the Scriptures. May God, the source of all patience and encouragement, enable you to live in perfect harmony with one another according to the spirit of Christ Jesus Romans 15: 4, 5.

Therefore, since we for our part are surrounded by this cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every encumbrance of sin which clings to us and persevere in running the race which lies ahead Hebrews 12: 1.

Realize that when your faith is tested this makes for endurance. Let endurance come to its perfection so that you may be fully mature and lacking in nothing James 1: 3, 4.

We are all pleased and delighted to indulge in the things we like pursuing such as recreation, hobbies, vacations and television viewing. These come easily because they demand so little from us, even though we invest them with a value far greater than they deserve. Our enthusiasm accelerates and we excite ourselves into enjoying them. Most times they demand little physical or mental effort. From the Byzantine Catholic perspective, there is the fundamental truth of stewardship of time, treasure and talent. The Byzantine Catholic truly knows he is accountable before the throne of Christ for how time, treasure and talent is spent or invested. Most spend time doing good things so they are wasted effort. What we truly need is a spirituality of investing these gifts with eternal values so they bring a worthwhile return to us. Far too many are profligate in their use of heavenly gifts. Most often nothing is done with them for the eternal benefit of the soul. What we desperately need in our commitment to the Saviour is to inspire in believers the distinct desire to do God's will and much as they wish to do their own will. For us who believe, our will and desire must be congruent with that of our Creator. That is the fundamental thought enunciated in the entire New Testament: to will what our God wills and to motivate ourselves to want to do what He want us to do. We must make His desire and will our own. That is simply how we deify and ennoble ourselves before Him.

"Your will be done" is a priority for believers. It is not a temporary thing, but an entire lifetime of subscribing to what our loving God desires of us: righteousness in all things. Our God continues to work miracles among us today. These take place in the minds and wills of those people who completely surrender to Him. The difficult matters He makes easier, and transforms the bitter into acceptable and life enhancing.

Byzantine Catholics are not off-duty Christians. Everything we do has eternal repecussions. In the strict sense of the word there are no seasonal or part-time believers, working for and worshipping only when it pleases us, or when worship has its source simply in us, or when it is convenient in our life schedule. Those who so live are a contradiction of the genuine Christian way of life.

We are urged by St. Paul to do everything in our lives for the greater glory of God. "And whatsoever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father." Regardless of what we do,, "whether eating or drinking, or anything else, we do all of the glory of God."
